■ The *Quest for the West Art Show and Sale (Quest)* brings the best in Western American art this September. Much more than a charitable event, the enterprise builds momentum for the artists and collectors who put the artistry of the American West on the map, while providing museum visitors month-long access to the groundbreaking portraits, landscapes, still lifes, and sculptures by masters within the genre.

Meet some of the biggest names in contemporary Western art during this 18th annual show, including G. Russell Case, Abigail Gutting, Donna Howell-Sickles, Howard Post, and H. David Wright. New artists this year include Luke Anderson, Dave LaMure Jr., Rich Loffler, and Ezra Tucker.

The art-inspired weekend begins on Friday, September 8, with a luck-of-the-draw miniature sale, which will feature smaller works created by many of the *Quest* artists.

The main event on Saturday, September 9, features a fixed-price sale, during which pre-registered attendees and absentee bidders participate in drawings to get the first opportunity to purchase desired works. If a bidder passes, additional bidders' names are drawn until each sale piece finds its new home.

That exhibit will remain accessible to the public through October 8.

This year's guest speaker, featured on both opening weekend days, is Jim Hatzell, an artist, photographer, and movie and TV film crew veteran known for his detailed and authentic representations of the West. He has worked on more than 75 Western movies and TV projects, including "Dances with Wolves," "Far and Away," "Gettysburg," and "Wyatt Earp." Jim also served as an advisor on "1883," the prequel to the hit TV series "Yellowstone."
